# **Report from DSWCI Jubilee**

# Participants

From Thursday the 4<sup>th</sup> of May till Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup> of May, 2006, no less than 33 persons took part in our very successful DSWCI 50 years Jubilee DX-Camp and Annual General Meeting (AGM) at Vejers Beach. ## First part of the Jubilee

The big DSWCI flag showed the way to scout camp Vardeborg where our DX-Camp and AGM was held in summer-like weather. Upon arrival, everyone received a DSWCI Jubilee Badge and a 48 pages Jubilee Book telling the 50 years history of the DSWCI. It will be sent to other members later this summer.

Of particular interest were special programmes from four radio stations during these four days:

1. Live interview of Kaj Bredahl Jørgensen and Kurt Pedersen at the local, private station, Radio Charlie, Varde on 100.7 MHz.

2. Phone interview of Anker Petersen from Radio Japan in their English programme "World Interactive".

3. Greetings to the DSWCI DX Camp from Scandinavian Weekend Radio in their live broadcast on 6170 and 11690 kHz.

4. Nine hours of live broadcast from the Italian Pirate station, Mystery Radio, on 6220 kHz with numerous greetings to DSWCI.

(Furthermore on May 27-29 our Japanese member Toshimichi Ohtake reported from the Jubilee in "World Interactive" of Radio Japan and interviewed the DSWCI Chairman.)

All correct reception reports on these five special programmes are going to be verified with a special Jubilee QSL-card, if reported directly to the DSWCI. Please include return postage.

On Friday morning most participants paid a visit to the historical Varde Jugendhaus from 1901, built in German Jugend Style, with exhibitions of untraditional paintings by the local painter Otto Frello and of Danish terracotta. After that a typical Danish lunch with "Smørrebrød" at a restaurant in the beautiful Arnbjerg Park.

At 1530-1800 followed four power point presentations at Strandhotellet in Vejers Strand:

1. Director of Production Support of Radio Free Asia, Washington Andrew "A. J." Janitschek: "Radio Free Asia: More than Shortwave". A. J. gave an update on RFA Shortwave broadcasting and pointed out the additional, new RFA media to listeners in East and South East Asia: Satellite Direct-to-Home Broadcasts, Internet Live Streaming and Podcasting. A. J. further offered a special RFA QSL during April-June 2006 with the DSWCI logo for all reports sent to RFA (schedules & report form at <u>www.rfa.org</u>). Five complete packages of RFA QSL's offered for our Lottery.

2. Bjarke Vestesen then reported on his recent DX-pedition to Florida for four weeks, giving sound samples on his fine loggings. Bjarke furthermore explained how travelling with an AOR AR7030 can be done by using special handluggage.

3. Toshi Ohtake gave a status on "DX-ing in Japan year 2006", including the HAM Festival where our Sri Lankan member Victor Goonetilleke attended; the introduction of JSWC DX-programmes via Radio Japan, AWR Singapore and HCJB; and Toshi's visits to R Free Asia and WRMI after the NASWA Winterfest 2006.

4. Risto Vähäkainu then talked about "DX-ing in Finland year 2006", mentioning the history of the Finnish DX Association which will celebrate its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in the summer 2008 probably near Vasa. At present FDXA counts about 700 members! Risto Vähäkainu and Arto Mujunen successfully were leading the EDXC for five years. The FDXA has organized four EDXC Conferences (Jyväskylä 1971, Espoo 1987, Tampere 1992 and Pori 2002).

Tibor Szilagyi closed the session by announcing the coming EDXC Conference in St. Petersburg on Oct 19-22, 2006. It is important to register now!

Dario Monferini then told about "The National DX Meeting in Mexico 2005 and some experiences on travelling in that country.

7. George Brown attended the NASWA Winterfest in Kulpsville in March 2006 and told about the variety of its activities for DX-ers.

8. Anker Petersen closed the session by playing a short extract of the last "DX-Window" broadcast from Radio Denmark in 1969.
